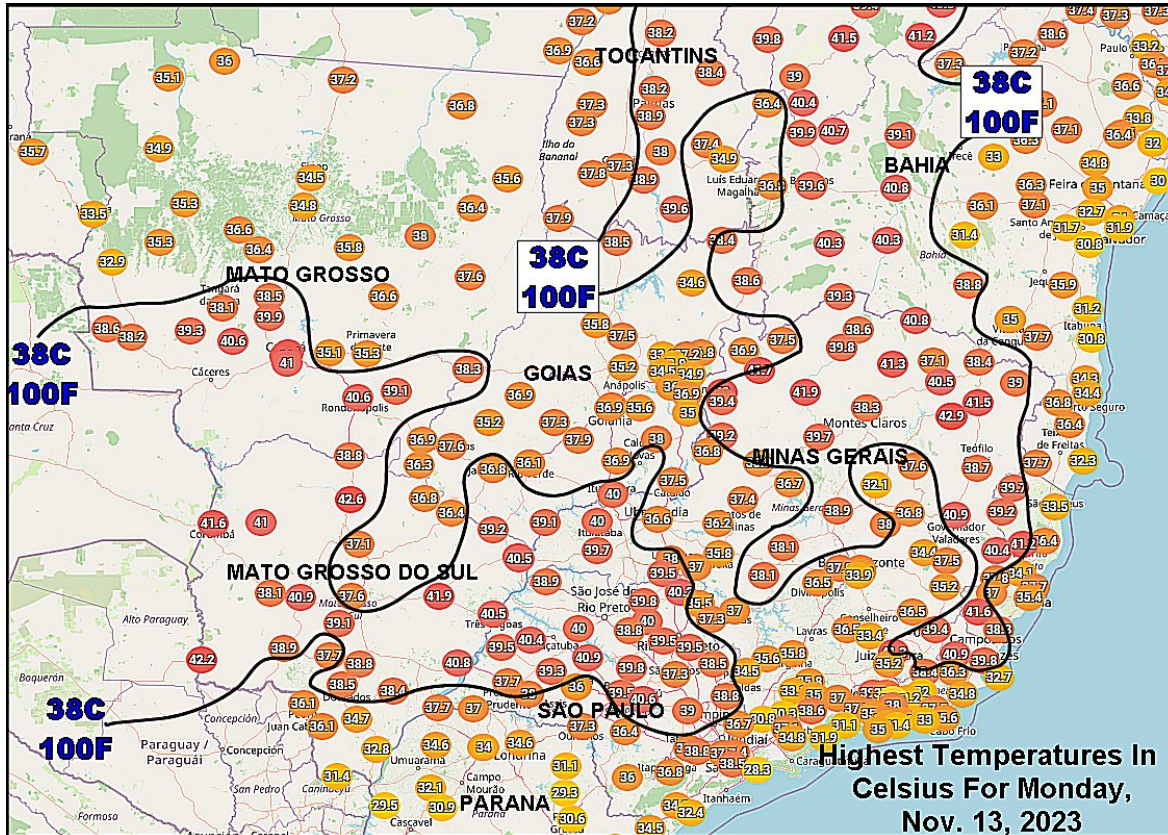


Excessive Heat In Brazil Stressing Crops, Livestock

Kansas City, November 14 (World Weather Inc.) – **An extremely rare mid-November heatwave in Brazil has complicated the impact of recent dryness in the nation.**

Monday afternoon temperatures were amazingly hot as expected with extremes reaching 110 and most readings in the upper 90s to 104 Fahrenheit. More heat is expected into Saturday before showers, clouds and higher relative humidity arrive to begin pulling back the temperatures. Seasonable readings with a slight warmer bias are likely in the middle to latter part of next week. **Stress on livestock and crops has been surging higher daily.**
