

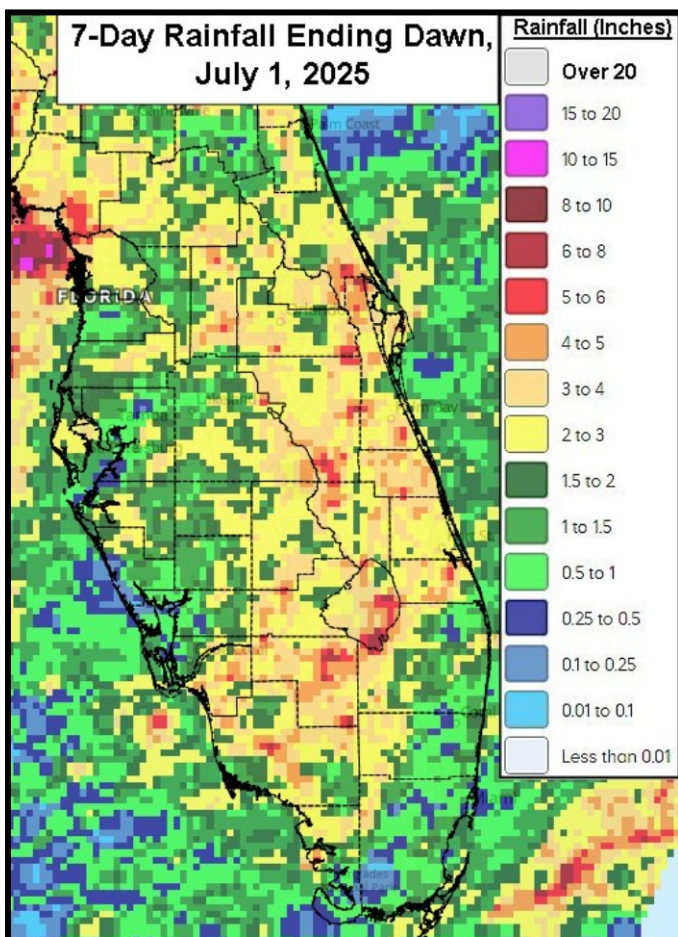
# Weekly Citrus Weather

Kansas City, July 1 (World Weather Inc.) – **Florida**'s citrus region received rain on a frequent basis during the past week with more on the way in the coming days. The environment will remain favorable for aggressive growth. **Mexico**'s main citrus areas also received monsoonal precipitation on a frequent basis during the past week. Additional monsoonal rain during the coming week will maintain a good outlook for the citrus. In **Brazil**, a cold front dropped temperatures into the 30s Fahrenheit for portions of Sao Paulo last week. While frost was possible, no significant damage or loss was suspected.

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## FLORIDA



Rain was scattered across Florida's citrus region on a frequent basis during the past week. Moisture totals for the seven-day period ending this morning ranged from 1.00 to 4.00 inches with local amounts of 5.00 inches or slightly more from Brevard and Osceola Counties into Hendry County and immediate neighboring locations. The combination of rain and irrigation promoted a relatively good environment for aggressive citrus development. Production potentials are favorable.

Temperatures were near or slightly above normal for much of citrus country during the past week. Daytime highs peaked from the upper 80s to mid-90s most days with pockets only warming to the mid-80s. Nighttime lows were in the upper 60s to mid-70s.

Rain and thunderstorms will continue for much of citrus country on a daily basis during the coming week. Some of the most significant

rain will occur through Friday as a weak frontal boundary advances over eastern North America. Moisture totals by next Tuesday morning will range from 1.00 to 4.00 inches with locally greater amounts. The rain combined with irrigation will continue to support a good environment for aggressive growth.

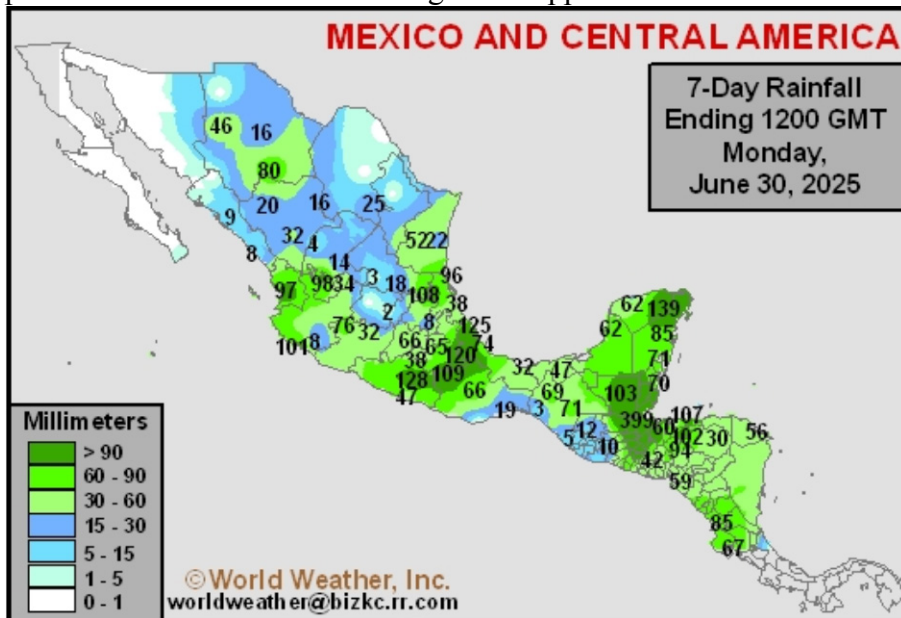
Seasonable to seasonably warm weather will prevail for Florida during the coming week. Daytime highs will peak from the mid-80s to lower 90s with pockets warming to the

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mid-90s later this weekend and early next week. Low temperatures will be in the low- to mid-70s with pockets occasionally cooling to the upper 60s.

### MEXICO

Mexico's main citrus areas received rain on a frequent basis during the past week. Oaxaca, Michoacan, and Colima into Puebla, Veracruz, and southeastern San Luis Potosi received 0.75 to 5.00 inches of rain for the seven-day period ending June 30. Tamaulipas and other areas in San Luis Potosi into portions of Nuevo Leon received 0.71 to 2.05 inches of rain, though pockets only received light precipitation. Temperatures were near normal with highest readings in the 80s and 90s. Lowest temperatures were in the 60s and 70s with pockets in eastern Mexico cooling to the upper 50s.



Additional rain during the past week continued to promote a good environment for citrus development across western, east-central, and northeastern Mexico. There are still a few locations in Nuevo Leon and immediate neighboring areas that would benefit from a boost in precipitation to

support ideal long-term crop prospects.

Monsoonal rain will continue across the main citrus areas in Mexico during the coming week. Some of the most widespread rain will occur through Thursday, though erratic rain will prevail Friday into early next week. Western and east-central Mexico into San Luis Potosi and southern Tamaulipas will receive 0.75 to 3.00 inches of rain with local amounts over 4.00 inches by next Tuesday morning. Other locations in Tamaulipas into Nuevo Leon will receive 0.25 to 1.50 inches of rain with drier pockets. Temperatures will be near normal with daytime highs reaching the 80s and 90s. Pockets in northeastern Mexico will occasionally warm above 100 degrees during drier periods as well. Low temperatures will be in the 60s and 70s.

Waves of rain will continue to promote a good environment for citrus in much of Mexico during the coming week. However, Nuevo Leon and portions of Tamaulipas would benefit from a boost in rain later in July to ensure a good outlook for the citrus.

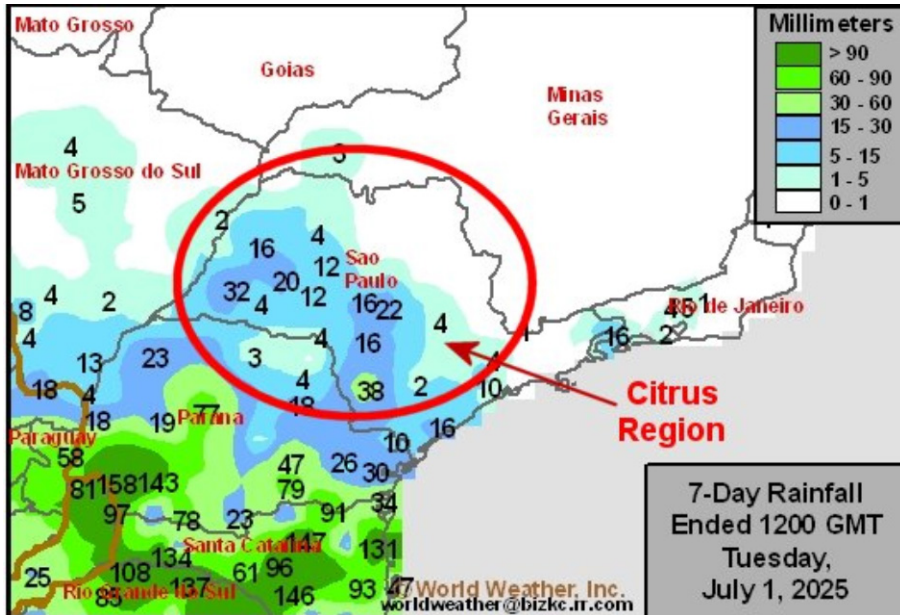
### BRAZIL

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Portions of western, central, and southern Sao Paulo received rain at times during the past week. Moisture totals for the seven-day period ending this morning ranged from 0.16 to 0.87 inch with local amounts up to 1.50 inches. Other locations in Sao Paulo and much of southwestern Minas Gerais received little to no rain. Temperatures were near to slightly above normal with highest readings in the 80s. Lowest temperatures were in the 30s and

40s.

Pockets of frost or light freezes may have occurred in Sao Paulo following a cold front last week. Citrus damage was suspected of being minimal outside some minor leaf burning. Overall, production potentials should be unchanged. The periods of rain during the past week may have otherwise



briefly slowed harvesting and general farming activity in the wettest locations of Sao Paulo.

Sao Paulo and southwestern Minas Gerais will be mostly dry during the coming week. Any rain that does occur will be lost to evaporation. Temperatures will be near to above normal. Daytime highs will peak to the 70s and lower 80s with pockets in western Sao Paulo and southwestern Minas Gerais warming to the upper 80s at times. Low temperatures will be in the 40s and 50s. The environment will be favorable for harvesting and general farming activity.

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
