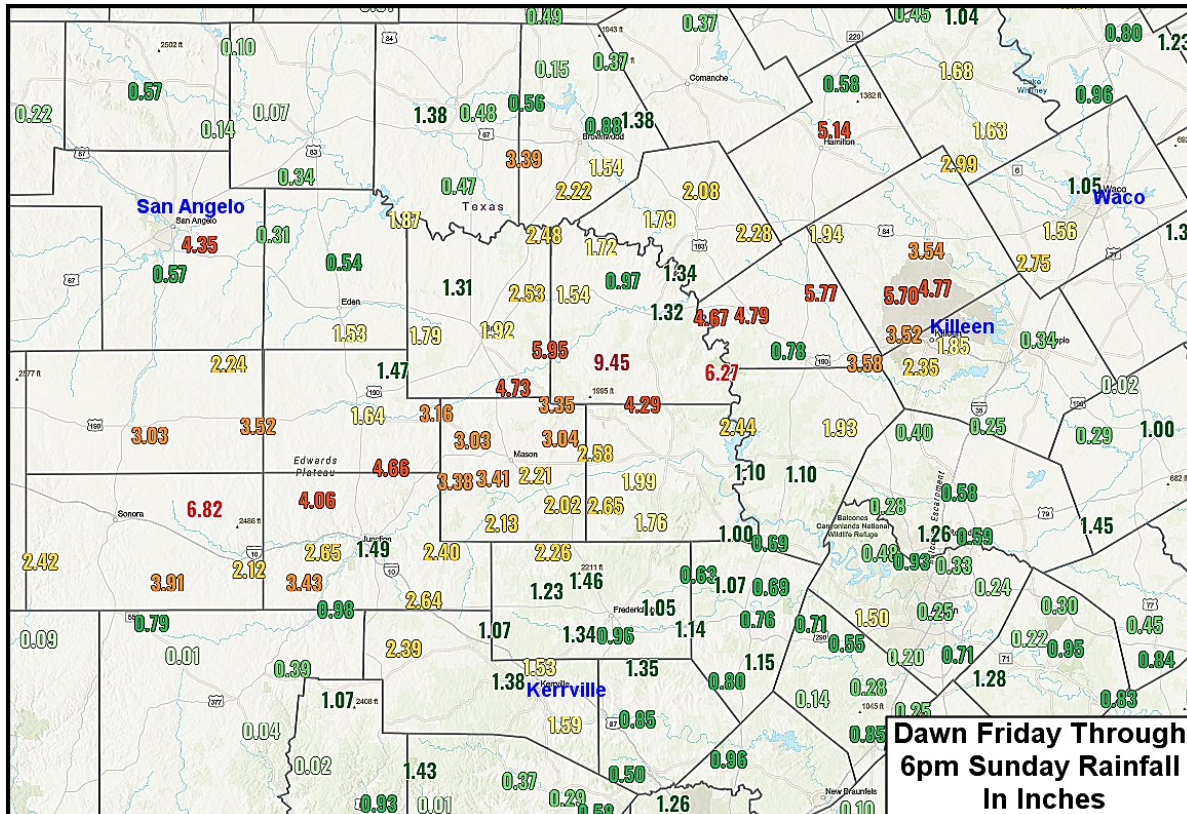


Another Round of Heavy Weekend Rain In Central Texas

Kansas City, July 14 (World Weather Inc.) – [Another round of heavy rain fell across portions of central Texas during the weekend producing some additional flooding after horrific flooding and record setting rain fell in the region during the U.S. Independence Day holiday weekend earlier this month.](#)



The greatest rain this most recent weekend occurred between San Angelo and Waco, Killeen and Kerrville, Texas where rain totals of 2.00 to more than 4.00 inches was common and local totals varying from 4.00 to 9.45 inches. The flooding this time around was not as horrific, but the region was already saturated with moisture and the additional precipitation quickly brought back some flooding to the region. That precipitation has since ended and the outlook is now looking to be much drier in the coming week – of course, that was suggested last week as well.

The region produces livestock corn, sorghum and a few other crops – all of which have been negatively impacted by this month's torrential rain. The losses should not have a big impact on nationwide production because of the small amount of production that comes from that region. That does not nullify the significance of damage and losses incurred in the region since the beginning of this month.

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
