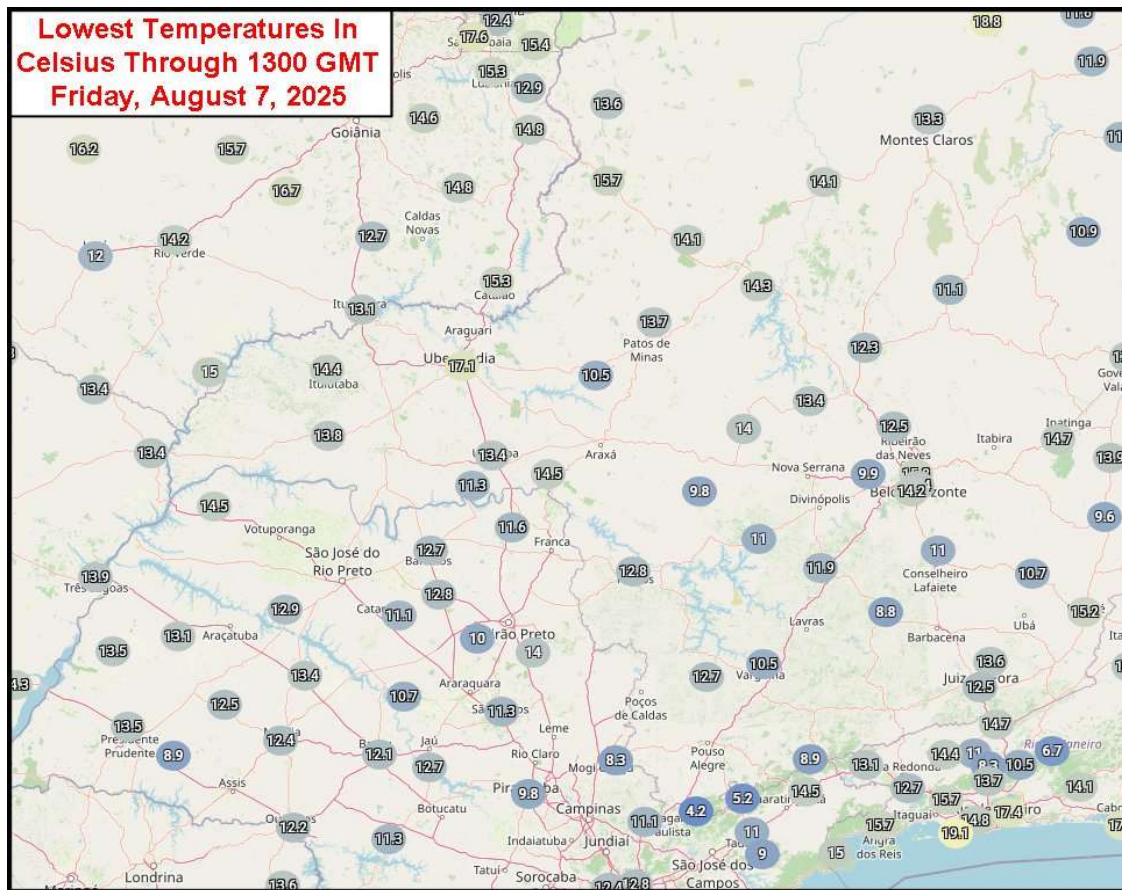


No Crop Risk From Slight Cooler Bias This Weekend In Brazil

Kansas City, August 7 (World Weather, Inc.) – Another dry and mild to warm day occurred in Brazil coffee areas Wednesday and little change was expected today. Cooling is likely from south to north Friday and Saturday with the period from Saturday through Monday coolest. Temperatures may slip to +2 Celsius in a spot or two, but no widespread frost event is expected. Most temperatures will be well above the frost threshold and warming is expected for a while next week. Rainfall should be kept minimal. Coffee areas in Ivory Coast and Ghana will see a mix of rain and sunshine during the next week with the week's greatest rain expected to the north of most coffee areas.

Coffee areas were mostly dry Wednesday and temperatures were mild to warm. Highest afternoon readings varied in the 20s except in far northeastern Minas Gerais where one location reached 32 Celsius. Low temperatures this morning were in the upper single digits through the teens.



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A cool front racing through Parana, Sao Paulo and southern Sul de Minas Friday through Saturday will generate a few showers producing up to 6 millimeters of rain. Otherwise, there will not be much precipitation in the next ten days. Showers will continue periodically through the next week to ten days near the coast of Espirito Santo and Bahia with no more than 8 millimeters of daily rain possible.

Mild to warm weather is expected today and again Friday in the northern production areas where daily high temperatures will reach the 20s and lower 30s. Northern Minas Gerais and south-central Bahia will be warmest.

Cooling is likely Friday through Sunday with the period Saturday through Tuesday coolest. Low temperatures during that period will be in the single digits and teens with a few extremes of +2 to +4. Some patches of soft frost are possible in low-lying areas; though, the impact will be minimal. High temperatures during the cooler days will be in the upper teens and lower to a few middle 20s Celsius.

Warming is expected early to mid-week next week, although one more bout of cool is possible during the latter part of the week. The cooling will be no more significant than that which occurs this coming weekend into early next week.

COLOMBIA/VENEZUELA

Scattered and mostly light showers occurred in southern Colombia Wednesday while many areas from central into northern Colombia and western Venezuela received light to moderate rain.

Daily showers and thunderstorms will continue to impact coffee areas from Colombia into western Venezuela through the next week. Most of the precipitation will be light to moderate in intensity with a few locally heavy bouts of rain possible. All areas will receive rain at one time or another with most areas seeing multiple rounds of rain that will support normal crop development. Southern Colombia will continue to see the least rain and parts of the region may dry down overall.

PERU

Peru's coffee areas were mostly dry Wednesday. Isolated to scattered showers and thunderstorms will occur most days through the next week. Showers will be possible in nearly all areas at one time or another, although the daily distribution will be often sporadic and light and some areas will dry down.

PUERTO RICO, DOMINICAN REPUBLIC AND CUBA

Isolated to scattered showers occurred from eastern Cuba to Dominican Republic and Puerto Rico Wednesday where resulting rain was light to locally moderate.

Periodic shower and thunderstorm activity is anticipated in the Great Antilles through the next week. Most of the daily rain will be light to moderate with a few infrequent stronger thunderstorms possible. The precipitation will impact all coffee areas eventually. No tropical cyclones are expected to impact the region through the middle of next week with some potential for a tropical disturbance to impact the region late next week.

MEXICO AND CENTRAL AMERICA

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Much of Costa Rica and a large part of southern Mexico received light to moderate rain Wednesday while Tropical Storm Ivo was far enough from Mexico's Pacific coast that impacts from the storm were limited. Isolated to scattered and mostly light showers occurred elsewhere.

Frequent showers and thunderstorms will impact Mexico and Central America through the next week. The precipitation will vary greatly with light to moderate and locally heavy rain expected daily. The moisture will be sufficient to support normal coffee and cocoa development.

VIETNAM

Many areas in the Central Highlands received light to locally moderate rain Wednesday while much of Quang Tri and northern Vietnam received light to moderate and locally heavy rain.

An isolated to scattered shower and thunderstorm pattern will occur through Monday in most coffee area across Vietnam where resulting rain will be light to locally moderate most often and some areas will dry down. Rain will increase Tuesday into late next week with scattered to numerous showers and thunderstorms occur most days with light to moderate and locally heavy rain resulting most often.

IVORY COAST/GHANA/NIGERIA/CAMEROON

Coffee areas in Ivory Coast were mostly dry Wednesday while scattered and light showers occurred in Ghana and southern Benin. Large parts of southeastern Nigeria and



northwestern Cameroon received light to moderate rain while southern Cameroon was mostly dry.

A mix of rain and sunshine will occur through the next week from Ivory Coast through southern Benin. All areas will receive multiple rounds of rain during the period with the periods of dry weather likely long enough to allow some areas to dry down overall while greater rain falls to the north of most coffee areas. Frequent rounds of showers and

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thunderstorms will occur from southeastern Nigeria into northwestern Cameroon where light to moderate and locally heavy rain will result most often. Southern Cameroon will see scattered showers will into Friday with light to moderate rain resulting before shower activity diminishes this weekend into next week.

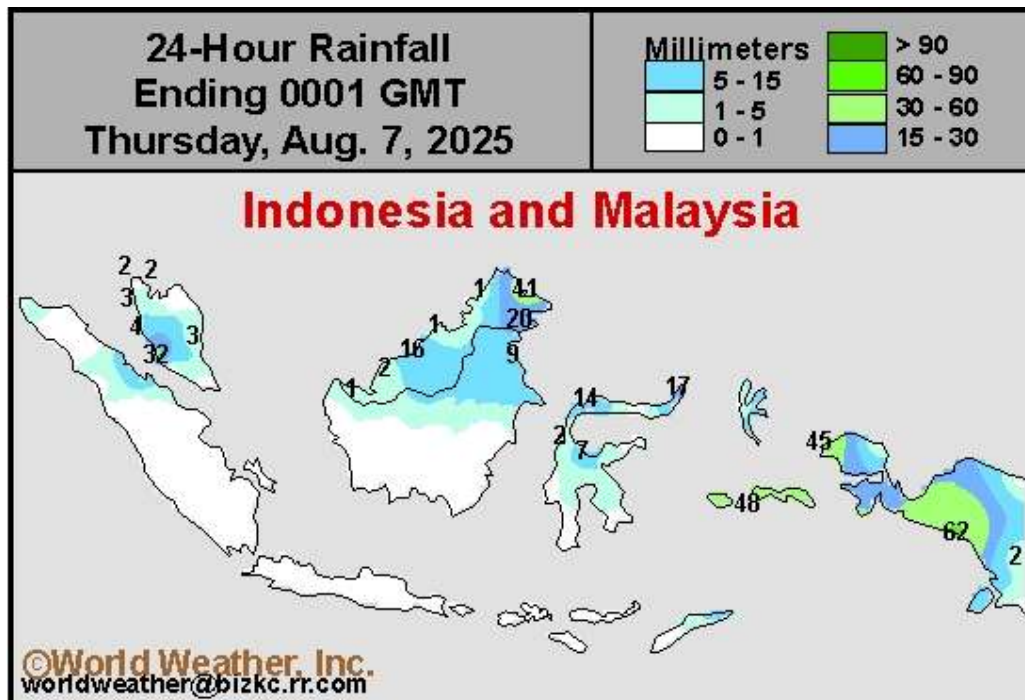
EAST-CENTRAL AFRICA (Ethiopia, Uganda, Kenya, and Tanzania)

Tanzania into Uganda and southwestern Kenya was mostly dry Wednesday while large parts of Ethiopia received light to locally moderate rain.

Scattered to numerous showers and thunderstorms will occur most days through the next week from central and northern Uganda into Ethiopia with light to locally moderate rain resulting most often. Southwestern Kenya into southern Uganda will see isolated to scattered and often light showers most days while a few light and infrequent showers develop in northeastern Tanzania. The Pare region of Tanzania will be mostly dry.

INDONESIA

Satellite imagery suggested light to moderate and locally heavy rain fell on northern Sumatra



Wednesday while light to locally moderate rain fell on portions of central Sulawesi. A few light showers occurred in southern Sumatra and western Java while most other areas were dry.

An improving trend for rainfall and coffee conditions is still expected through the next week from Sumatra into western Java and Timor. Isolated to scattered showers will occur most days with light to moderate rain resulting most often while some areas should still dry down overall. Rain will be infrequent and light from central Java into Timor where much of the region will dry down.

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INDIA

A large part of southern India's coffee region received light to moderate rain Wednesday. Rain will increase today through Saturday when scattered to numerous coverage of light to moderate and locally heavy rain will occur each day and irrigation needs should be reduced. Shower activity will diminish again Sunday into next week when isolated to scattered and often light showers occur most days.

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
